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Manager’s Report

Tuesday

08/31/21

Councilors:

Following is my written summary of notable or significant municipal activities originating from or coordinated by the Manager’s office for the preceding week. I provide this in lieu of a verbal report at the Council meeting, but will certainly address any questions you may have during the meeting.

COVID UPDATE:

As you know, due to the state and national surge in Delta Variant COVID cases, I issued a “Masking Requirement” for all City owned buildings and City sponsored events on Monday, 8/23, which went into effect on Wednesday, 8/25. The limited feedback I have received so far has been mostly positive. This masking requirement will stay in effect indefinitely.

OPERATIONAL ITEMS:

ASSESSOR VACANCY UPDATE: I responded on Friday, 8/27, to the Assessor candidate who had questions/requests for clarifications to our employment offer of 8/20. I am hopeful to receive a positive response this coming week.

CENTRAL VERMONT PATH DISCUSSION. A ZOOM discussion was organized by Christian Meyer, Senior Transportation Planner with the Central Vermont Regional Planning Commission. Representatives from Berlin, Barre Town, Barre City and Montpelier participated in a holistic discussion of the current planning and implementation status of multi-use paths, bike lanes, trails, and any other bike and pedestrian facilities in the region and how this network may grow to connect the four towns. There was an overview discussion of each town's achievements, various path development initiatives/proposals and consideration of preparation of an “official” map to guide future implementation. Participants for Barre City were the Mayor, Manager, Planning Director, and the Path, Routes, and Trails Committee Chair.

METRO WAY PATH DESIGN DEVELOPEMENT: DPW Director Bill Ahearn and I had what we consider to be a successful coordination meeting with VTrans management and survey personnel this past week, and believe we established a path forward addressing a significant boundary line issue that has stalled progress on the development of this path segment for approximately one (1) year. We are in the process in the next week or so of preparing a written summary of the meeting and the tentative prior agreements of related design issues/details. I am hopeful that by mid-September we will reach formal written agreement of all design issues such that we can proceed to prepare “Final” construction plans, in biddable, “shovel ready” status such that we can bid the project by March 1, 2022 for summer 2022 construction. We will keep you posted on progress.

EVENTS:

VCRD COMMUNITY VISIT: The “All in for Barre” Community visit was held successfully this past Wednesday, 8/25. Despite the COVID related changing environment of the last few weeks, reasonable precautions were taken and all nine primary discussion sessions occurred as planned. Under the circumstances, they were reasonably well attended, including a virtual session put in place as part of the COVID response. Following is a post-visit update from VCRD as to next Steps and the next community meeting date:

*“VCRD staff will get to work over the next couple of weeks digesting your input, and we'll compile a list of ideas to bring back to you all at the next meeting on Wednesday, **September 29th from 6:30-9:00pm.** We've booked the Barre Auditorium and are working to develop virtual / hybrid options for participation based on the public health situation. We will be back in touch with more details soon.*

*Next month, we'll review the ideas gathered, and vote to prioritize several for locally-driven action. We'll be working hard in the coming weeks to invite everyone in the community to join the meeting on the 29th, and **we hope you'll help us spread the word. Everyone is welcome**, even folks who weren't able to make it on Wednesday.*

*Finally, if you didn't get a chance to share your ideas this week, or know of folks who haven't had the chance to weigh in, **this survey** (see copy attached and link below) will be live through September 15th to gather any additional thoughts. Paper copies and submission boxes are also available at the Aldrich Library and City Hall.”*

The Regular Meeting of the Barre City Council was called to order in person and via video platform by Mayor Lucas Herring at 7:05 PM at Barre City Hall. Mayor Herring said it will be added to the end of the new items.

City Manager's Report - Manager Mackenzie noted his report was sent out via email.

Visitors and Communications – NONE

Old Business –

A) Approve Assignment of East Montpelier Parcel Sale Proceeds.

Manager Mackenzie reviewed his memo and recommended Council assign the proceeds to the Capital Improvement Fund. Council approved the recommendation on motion of Councilor Waszazak, seconded by Councilor Cambel. **Motion carried.**

New Business –

A) Community Picnic Update.

Mayor Herring said due to COVID restrictions regarding hand washing stations, the community picnic has been canceled.

C) Barre Area Development Quarterly Update.

Barre Area Development executive director Cody Morrison gave a Powerpoint update on BADC activities since the last report, including securing grant funding for City infrastructure projects and the farmers market, assisting with review of the TIF district, business recruitment and retention, marketing initiatives, increasing Google activity, social media, and promotions through VT Tourism and Marketing. There was discussion on marketing and metrics for success, and Mr. Morrison said he would share reporting with the Council.

B) Aldrich Library Quarterly Update.

Library executive director Loren Polk gave a Powerpoint presentation update on library activities since the last report, including increased circulation now that people can come into the library, collections guides on the website curated by staff, offering outdoor and virtual programs, offering in-person senior days again, summer meal site, and monthly book sales.

D) Barre Partnership Quarterly Update.

Partnership executive director Tracie Lewis gave a Powerpoint presentation update on Partnership activities since the last report, including the farmers market, Food Truck Thursdays, concerts in Currier Park, Barre Blooms flowerpots throughout the downtown, ribbon cuttings and business anniversaries, Barre Art Splash, and the Fall Festival scheduled for September 30th through October 2nd.

E) Downstreet Building Relocation Follow Up.

Capstone Community Action board member Jon Valsangiacomo noted for the record this agenda item is related to Capstone, not Downstreet. Capstone executive director Sue Minter reviewed the programs offered by the organization, serving Washington, Lamoille and Orange Counties. Ms. Minter said they received federal funding to expand the Head Start program at their Brook Street location. The expansion will allow them to serve a significant increase in children and families, but the funding requires an increase in available parking. The plan calls for the purchase and demolition of the three-unit apartment building next door to accommodate new parking. At the urging of the Council, Capstone has been working with the City and other local organizations to try and find a way to relocate the building so as not to lose the housing units, however no suitable location could be identified, and the move is cost prohibitive. There was discussion on the positive impact on the City from the expansion of the Head Start program, and traffic enforcement in this dangerous area. Councilors thanked Ms. Minter and Capstone for their efforts, and it was noted all tenants in the apartment building have been successfully rehoused.

F) Animal and Fowl Task Force Ordinance Change Presentation.

Task Force member John LePage and Health Officer Robert Howarth reviewed the draft revisions. There was discussion on definitions, species of poultry allowed in the City, functions of the Animal Control Committee, variances, exceptions and appeals. Mayor Herring said the next step will be a first reading at a future Council meeting.

G) Approval to Apply for an ERSA Trail Grant for the Cow Pasture.

Cow Pasture Committee members Janette Shaffer, Jim Deshler and Tim Rapczynski spoke of the Enhanced Recreation Stewardship and Access Trail Grant application (ERSA), which would provide funding to purchase a parcel of land to preserve parking access for the Cow Pasture. It would also allow some trail enhancement to mitigate interference between trail walkers and snowmobilers. Planning Director Janet Shatney showed a map of the lots under consideration for purchase. Council approved submitting the grant application on motion of Councilor Waszazak, seconded by Councilor Reil. **Motion carried.**

H) Discussion of Criteria and Process for Selecting ARPA-Funded Projects.

This item is deferred.

I) Police Chief Recruitment Process Briefing.

Manager Mackenzie reviewed his memos on the recruitment process including makeup of the selection panel for screening and reviewing, target schedule dates, and draft job description. The Manager said his hope would be to have a new chief on board by late December or early January, and he would appoint the current Deputy Chief as acting chief between Chief Bombardier's retirement the end of October and the arrival of the new chief. Councilor Waszazak asked to be named as the Council liaison to the panel, and the Council gave unofficial approval.

From consent agenda H. Approval of Resolution 2021-12: City of Barre Water & Sewage Rates Schedule – Effective 09-01-2021.

Manager Mackenzie, Public Works Director Ahearn, Mayor Herring, and Councilor Waszazak reviewed past Council discussions and actions surrounding this topic, and previous approvals of the rate schedule and annual increases. There was discussion on comparisons between Barre City rates and those of other similarly-sized communities, base charges vs. usage charges, and impact on rates from unanticipated expenses related to the North Main Street reconstruction project.

Council approved ratification of the resolution on motion of Councilor Cambel, seconded by Councilor Stockwell. **Motion carried.**

Round Table –

Manager Mackenzie said COVID-19 protocols have been upgraded, and masks will be required in all City buildings beginning tomorrow, regardless of vaccination status. The Manager said the mask mandate will be in effect for tomorrow's All in for Barre community visit events.

Councilor Waszazak said the library will be holding a book sale this Friday and Saturday.

Mayor Herring reminded the Council that future agendas are available for their review on Sharepoint.

Executive Session –

Councilor Stockwell made the motion to find that premature general knowledge of litigation to be discussed would clearly place the City of Barre at a substantial disadvantage should the discussion be public. The motion was seconded by Councilor Hemmerick. **Motion carried.**

Council went into executive session at 10:00 PM to discuss litigation under the provisions of 1 VSA sec. 313 on motion of Councilor Stockwell, seconded by Councilor Hemmerick. **Motion carried.**

Manager Mackenzie and Clerk Dawes were invited into the executive session.

Clerk Dawes left the executive session at 10:05 PM.

Council came out of executive session at 10:25 PM on motion of Councilor Stockwell, seconded by Councilor Waszazak. **Motion carried.**

No action was taken.

The meeting adjourned at 10:25 PM on motion of Councilor Waszazak, seconded by Councilor Hemmerick. **Motion carried.**

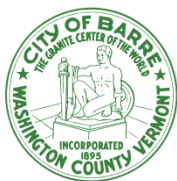

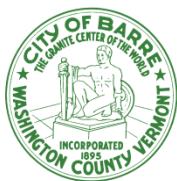

I am an unsheltered domestic violence survivor who has been unsheltered in Barre/Montpelier area for 6 years now while sleeping in my van to survive. During these six years I have been a Peer Support Person helping many of the unsheltered fill out housing application, ID paperwork, and fill out Social Security applications, just to name a few things. In February 2021, I added Independent Advocate for the Unsheltered to my resume. I have spoken at the VT State house, addressed the Appropriation Committees for both the VT House & VT Senate, twice, I have been interviewed by NBC Boston, by the VT Digger, and several other reporters, I have addressed a member of Senator Leahy's office on the same matter and I have addressed the Barre City Council on the homelessness issues we are facing.

I am currently being housed in a Motel in the local area, waiting for an apartment to open up, that will accept my housing voucher along with many other people. As you can see I am very passionate about this matter and I feel that I would be a great asset to the Task Force for many reasons; I am one of the unsheltered people living this crisis and I live & talk with the unsheltered daily with their concerns and what they need, just to name a couple.

In order to keep you informed of the Department activities of the office, I'm forwarding this report of activities of the City staff for the previous Friday - Thursday. If there are any additional questions please do not hesitate to ask.

1. CLERK/TREASURER'S OFFICE:

- The VT COVID Arrearage Assistance Program (VCAAP II) is up and running, providing assistance paying overdue water/sewer bills for residential and commercial properties. Applications will be received on a first come/first served basis until October 25th. Those with arrearages going back to April 2020 may apply. We're spreading the word through social media and flyers sent out with delinquent bills. To date 25+ people have applied.
- The City has posted information on Front Porch Forum and the website about the mortgage assistance program being offered by the state with COVID relief funds.
- The City is working with Opportunities Credit Union to spread the word about financial management and mortgage assistance available through the CU. We will be partnering on a series of workshops this fall.
- The City is spreading the word about the renter assistance program being offered by the state, which helps renters with delinquent rent and utilities associated with COVID-related financial hardship. To date no renters have applied for assistance with delinquent water/sewer bills.
- There are two properties still scheduled for tax sale on September 9th. There were originally 10 properties scheduled for tax sale, however 8 of them have been paid off to date. We expect at least one more to be paid off before the sale date.
