## More on Community Innovation, ARPA Funds

## What are Community Innovation Funds?

As part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), the City of Barre has special, one-time funding to support transformative community projects which can be leveraged by additional funding from outside organizations. The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) established the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) which provides \$350 billion to state and local governments across the nation for the response to and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Of Vermont's \$1.25 billion share, over \$200 million (about \$300 per Vermonter) was allocated to municipalities. The City of Barre received \$2.5 million and needs to decide what to spend these funds on by December 31, 2024. The funds must be spent by December 31, 2026.

This survey is one step in the process of understanding how best to use ARPA funds to respond to and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic in a way which reflects the needs and interests of those living and working in the City of Barre.
